MINUTES OF MAY 7, 2014**

Mick Jessop called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

B. PUBLIC COMMENT: None

C. PRESENTATIONS, ANNOUNCEMENTS, APPOINTMENTS:

Scott Christian gave the Landscape Report Spring 2014 with the following updates: MAD contract, winter cold damage, last 4 years of planting, play structures, drought, and CALSENSE sprinkler system, agenda attached. Scott stated that the City renewed the contract with New Image since they have given the City good service with a reasonable price. Both New Image and the City agreed to a 4 year contract with yearly reviews with an option to put up to bid if landscaping work was not up to City standards. Discussion with watering the City Parks continued with Scott stating that sprinklers are turned off during the rainy season. Commissioner Roger Begley asked about Montebello Park since the City has minimal dollars for maintenance. Scott reported that he was informed by Dan Kaspersen and approved by City Council that Montebello Park water would not be turned back on until further notice due to the budget.

Approval of Minutes:

E. GENERAL BUSINESS

1. Lawler Ranch Park Master Plan: Mick Jessop reported that approximately 50 Lawler Ranch residents attended the April 24 meeting at the Nelson Community Center. Discussions included maximizing the grass area and if a dog park is added, it may take away other future development. Mick added that traffic in Lawler Ranch may increase with a new dog park which maybe appealing to dog owners outside the City. Mick stated that the next Lawler Ranch Park Master Plan meeting will be June 5 at the Nelson Community Center.

2. Get Out and Enjoy the Park Day: Cathy Rader distributed flyers for Get Out and the Park Day. With Chairman Angel Borja absent and Mick Jessop leaving the meeting to attend the City Council Meeting for a presentation, updates could not be confirmed. Cathy said she would get final information out to the Parks & Recreation Commissioners via email next week.

 - e. Senior Center Report – The Newsletter and Activities Calendar were distributed. Cathy Rader stated that the Senior Dinner is currently advertised in the May Breeze Calendar and will be in the Daily Republic Weekly Calendar the week of the Senior Dinner which will be on May 29.

2. Commission – Commissioner Roger Begley would like to add the Park Inspections Reports on the next agenda. Cathy Rader asked Vice-chair John Pierce if he was on the Friday Night Softball League again and if he could report his observations on how the league is doing so far. John had some concerns with the lack of alcohol control and that Friday nights are not a family friendly environment. Cathy said she would forward the information to Mick Jessop. John would like to add The Montebello Park MAD throughout the City to the June 4 Commissions Meeting.


