MINUTES OF APRIL 17, 2013**

Mick Jessop called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m.

Approval of Minutes:

The minutes of March 6, 2013 meeting were approved with a 5-0 vote. Motion to approve made by Vice-chair John Pierce, seconded by Commissioner Tom Conley.

E. GENERAL BUSINESS

Lawler Ranch Park Master Plan: Mick Jessop discussed the Lawler Ranch Park Report on Community Planning Workshop #1 dated April 5, 2004 and Workshop #2 dated May 19, 2004. Mick reported that the Lawler Ranch Park residents were not in favor of restrooms or a parking lot. Residents wanted the park to stay as a neighborhood park that residents would be able to walk to and have street parking. Mick added that only one resident voted for a basketball court at Lawler Ranch Park. All other residents present voted against the basketball court due to the possibility of high non-resident traffic, a hang-out for youths, and with the expectations that the new Crescent Elementary School would have basketball courts open to the residents. Most residents did not want a basketball court in the park. Mick suggested that there is another meeting scheduled with the Lawler Ranch residents to re-visit the 1/3rd of the undeveloped park and if there are the funds being generated by the MAD to maintain the parks improvement. Mick stated that raising the rates would be an option but would only happen by a vote of the Lawler Ranch residents. Mick presented three display boards and explained the difference to the Commissioners. Vice-chair John Pierce stated that he would like to see the numbers first to see if the City will be able to maintain the undeveloped portion. Commissioner Tom Conley stated that if a half basketball court is voted by the residents, it should be visible from the street so that Police would be able to monitor and not be placed in back of the park. John added that the half basketball court at Dan O. Root Elementary School is functional and effective in keeping it a family oriented court. Chairman Angel Borja would like to review the MAD numbers and would like to see Lawler Ranch Park as full functioning park. Mick stated that Lawler Ranch Park numbers will be discussed at the next Parks and Recreation Commissions meeting if the numbers could be acquired so quickly.

1. Staff

- a. City Council – Commissioner Roger Begley attended the City Council meeting and gave an update. Roger reported that the hedge between Main Street and the Promenade parking lot is dead and needs to be replaced or concrete poured.
- b. Park Development Fund – Mick stated that the monthly report was unchanged from last month since there was no activity.
- c. Recreation / Community Center – The monthly report was discussed.
- d. Marina Report – The Marina monthly report was discussed. Mick reported that the Marina will not have a tenant barbeque this year due to budgets and lack of tenant interest. The Blessing of the Boats is scheduled for the first Saturday in May. The Yacht Club customarily has a special dinner associated with the Blessings of the Boats.
- e. Senior Center Report – Mick Jessop reported that the renovation is going smoothly at the Senior Center with completion estimated the last week in May. Donations from the community, clubs and businesses will cover the cost of the re-grand opening on Friday, June 14. The Senior Dinner attendance will need to increase in order for the dinners to continue. Mick stated that the dinners will be evaluated and must cover the cost.

- 2. Commission: Commissioner Tom Conley reported that Jim Spearing will get back with him regarding the scoreboard for field 4 at Lambrecht Sports Complex. Vice-chair John Pierce gave an update with the Suisun City Community Foundation. John stated that the Foundation is re-organizing and moving forward, PG&E will be sponsoring Saturday Night Movies beginning in July 2013 and that they donated \$10,000 towards the 2012 Christmas Event and \$10,000 for the 2012 4th of July Event. Mick reported that the 2013 4th of July Event will be funded by the proceeds for the sale of Safe and Sane fireworks in 2012. Mick added that the Saturday Night Movies will run for seven weeks this year vs. eight last year due to the holiday weekend being earlier this year. Chairman Angel Borja reported that Earth Day will be April 20 with approximately 100 volunteers to pick up trash around Fairfield-Suisun. Local artists will be making art pieces out of the trash collected. Angel stated that the barricades have been taken down on the Grizzly Island Trail and is currently being used by the community. Mick reported that the notice of completion still needs the approval of City Council and the ribbon cutting ceremony will be Tuesday, May 14.

G. ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 7:54 p.m. Motion to adjourn was made by Vice-chair John Pierce, seconded by Commissioner Tom Conley. Vote 5-0.
