AGENDA TRANSMITTAL

MEETING DATE: January 24, 2023

CITY AGENDA ITEM: Appointing _____ to the Vacant Councilmember Seat for the Remainder of the Current Term.

FISCAL IMPACT: None.

STRATEGIC PLAN: Provide Good Governance.

BACKGROUND: After the November 8, 2022, election, a current council member was elected to the office of the mayor. As such, that council member vacated their seat when sworn in as the new mayor. The result is that there is a vacancy on the City Council, which must be filled. The vacated office will terminate at the end of 2024.

Suisun Municipal Code Section 2.04.040 and Government Code Section 36512 govern the process by which vacancies in the elected offices of city council members are filled. Specifically, Section 36512 provides that a city council shall, within 60 days of the date of vacancy (i.e., no later than February 3, 2023), fill such vacancy by appointment, or call a special election to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the vacated term. Section 36512 does not provide any specific guidance on the manner in which the City Council selects an individual to fill a vacancy. Council has provided direction for an application process to fill the vacancy.

At the Council meeting on December 6, 2022, the Council directed the City Attorney's office to return at the December 20, 2022 meeting with the appropriate documentation to adopt an application and interview process. At the January 17th meeting, the City Council interviewed 11 applicants for the vacancy, and selected the following 6 applicants to move on to the January 24th meeting:

1. Anthony Adams
2. Herbert I. Dardon
3. Katrina Garcia
4. Steven M. Orly
5. Amit Pal
6. Jonathan R. Richardson

STAFF REPORT: On January 24, 2023, the City Council will deliberate on the six finalists and choose one candidate to fill the seat. The item may be continued further, but the City Council must take action no later than February 3, 2023, which is the date 60 days following the date the council seat was vacated (December 6, 2022). If the City Council does not appoint to the vacant seat by February 3rd, it will call a special election.

The following is the process that Council approved for the final interview process:

Procedure to conduct interviews and appoint a Councilmember

- Any applicant who is not physically present for the interview shall be disqualified unless the City

Council finds their absence excusable with just cause. Candidates who are excused must participate by Zoom, and have their camera on for the entirety of their interview.

- The interviews will be the reverse order interviewed on January 17th as follows:

1. Herbert I. Dardon
2. Jonathan R. Richardson
3. Katrina Garcia
4. Anthony Adams
5. Steven Olry
6. Amit Pal

- Applicants will have up to 2 minutes to answer each of 4 questions from the City Council, one question from each Councilmember. Different questions may be asked of all applicants.
- Public Comment will open after all applicants have been interviewed and shall be limited to 2 minutes per speaker.
- Applicants will not be allowed to participate in Public Comment on this item.
- The City Council will deliberate following all interviews and Public Comment.
- The City Council has the option to do a preliminary vote to narrow down the pool of candidates further before deliberation.
- Following deliberation, City Council will select one candidate to fill the seat; alternatively, the proceedings may be continued. Once a candidate is selected, they will be sworn in immediately.
- The appointed councilmember will hold office for the unexpired balance of the vacated seat's term, as the vacancy occurred in the second half of the former incumbent's term, which runs through the end of 2024.
- The City Clerk will swear in the appointed Councilmember.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the City Council interview City Council applicants and appoint one candidate to fill the vacant seat on the City Council.

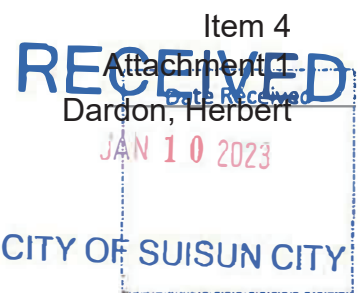

Suisun City operates under the Council/Manager form of governance in which the electorate chooses members of the City Council and the City Council hires the City Manager to implement City Council policy and run day-to-day affairs.

The Mayor and City Council are elected independently in non-partisan elections to serve four-year terms in office. The Mayor Pro-Tem is appointed by the Mayor from among its members. Suisun City has no term limits.

1. What are your top 3 priorities for Suisun City?

Public Safety

Enhanced Communication and Participation

Environment

Why do you think these are most important?

Public Safety

Ensure the protection of persons and property, Home, School and Place of Work.

Show the community that there is a commitment to potential dangers in the street. Develop a third-party complaint process for grievances related to homeless shelter services and subsidized housing, traffic, parks and shopping environments.

Recognize crime as a danger to public health, with an emphasis on prevention and remediation strategies: Crime prevention through environmental design. The right of all to enjoy public spaces, art, libraries, parks, and other non-commercial public spaces.

Enhanced Communication and Participation

Promote understanding of city government through education and public participation.

Ensure Sufficient funding and annual cost-to-continue increases for service providers.

Funded projects to have clear public benefits, and legally enforceable.

Strong support, adequate staffing, and funding for neighborhood planning, as well as stronger adherence to neighborhood plans and creation of neighborhood conservation districts.

Environment

Enhance the community's quality of life through responsible development of land and stewardship of the natural environment.

Improved enforcement of the Suisun City General Ordinances.

Zoning codes and development of infrastructures that further sustainability, such as community gardens; edible landscapes; water catchments; urban agriculture; run-off capture and prevention.

Development and maintenance of pedestrian and bicycling paths and increase access to bicycling for people who do not own motor vehicles.

2. What are the key issues you see facing our community?

Public Safety is a key issue in the community. There appears to be a lawless attitude being fostered amongst the younger citizens. There is no accountability and very little policing taking place. This is due to lack of law enforcement as the police force has not increased. The homeless population has increased and have become aggressive in their pan handling and are taking over parks and public walkways. Children do not feel safe in the parks.

Lack of Businesses. Small businesses have been leaving the city. There are no incentives to keep them in Suisun City. Businesses are folding due to lack of fundings or assistance from the city.

Government in the city. The council should represent the vast majority of its citizens. I would add that their characters should represent the communities. If everyone agrees on the same things there would be very little opportunity for challenges. The needs of each neighborhood should be addressed. Each person should have a voice in the council. I think it is time for residents and city government in Suisun City to deepen their relationship.

Why do you think these are the key issues and what might be the solutions?

If the citizens don't feel safe in the city, they will meet their needs somewhere else. They will shop at another city; they will buy homes in another city; they will go to parks at another city; they will contact contractors, businesses from another city. They will look for all of their entertainment where it is safe.

If Small business owners don't feel safe in the city, they will not promote their businesses. If the small business owner encounters hard times and the city cannot offer financial tools for them such as grants or loans, the small business will have no incentive to stay.

Government in the city should be more open to hearing from the residents. If the resident does not come to the Council meeting, take the council meeting to the residents. Inform the residents and attend public events.

3. What is your vision for Suisun City and how would you like the city to look in 10 years?

I believe the City Council should do the right thing for Suisun City families, do the right thing for a healthy community, and do the right thing for our common home.

I want to prioritize Suisun City working families in City decision-making, and I want to bring more compassion, collaboration, and community engagement to city government. That is why I am running to be your representative on the City Council.

I think the City Council should focus on issues that affect the quality of life for working families in Suisun City. Families are the foundation for Suisun City, and quality of life means thriving communities.

As Housing developments proceed, new housing will mean traffic impacts on existing roadways. Project decisions should therefore place a high priority on the needs of current working families.

My commitment is to listen to you respectfully and completely, and without telling you what to think or say. Transparency, honesty, respectful dialogue and active listening: these are the foundations to making city policy that works for you.

I think it is time for residents and city government in Suisun City to deepen their relationship: this means an exchange of meaningful commitments to each other. Residents should work to be as engaged with city government as they can; the City Council should commit to appointing more resident oversight commissions.

Residents can shape Suisun City by getting involved. And the needs and preferences of residents should be clearly reflected in City Council deliberations and decision making.

I believe that within 10 years, the community will flourish as they feel safe and look forward to patronizing the small businesses. They would be aware that Suisun City has programs to help the small businesses minded person. In Fact, the city should attract at least one big business to provide additional jobs.

This can only be done if the city officials make themselves visible and available to educate the residents.

Council meetings have been a great source. It's time to reach out to all neighborhoods.

4. Please describe how your qualifications, education, and/or work experience/training would be relevant in your role as a Councilmember.

I consider myself to be of fair and reasonable character. I came to the United States as an immigrant. I learned the ways of a new culture. Attended public schooling and Private schooling through the catholic school system. I grew up with many different cultures and learned to appreciate their ways. I learned to speak another language without losing my identity.

I attended San Francisco State University where I was exposed to additional cultures and was able to study them through Ethnic Studies and Black Studies opportunities. The opportunity to take psychology and sociology classes cemented my desire to support the growth of others.

My job opportunity opened up in the banking industry where I learned process and procedure. I better understood the process and the cycles used when retail stores closed and small owners depended on the bank's bookkeeping to maintain their payrolls and conform with legal requirements. Furthering my career in the networking aspect allowed me to serve the country by maintaining the integrity of the business components which relied on computers, networks and specialize people in specific roles to make the process work. I was a grunt worker promoted to team leader, promoted to manager.

During my experiences, I attended classes which guided me through the job requirements and helped to understand the purpose of the job and how it impacted the community. I learned and wrote procedures to support productivity in each position that I have held. I understand the importance of understanding and documenting every process. Everything is interdependent on the next to make it work successfully.

I have been a Pastor sixteen years. During this time, I've had the opportunity to assist families towards a better outlook towards life. I have dedicated most of my time to help educate men in their roles in the family and to look at the bigger picture. Our families are used to thinking that their life consists of going to school, work, and hope for the best. My philosophy has been to educate them on their purpose in life, show them how much others care and need them, remind them of principles and standards and help them see through their spiritual eyes. Not everything is black and white when living. There is always room for growth through faith and knowledge.

5. What has your previous involvement with the City of Suisun City been? Please include any service organizations or community engagement specific to Suisun City you have participated in and what your role was.

I have been a resident of Suisun City since 1989. I brought my Kids here From San Francisco for a better opportunity. Our first involvement was enrolling my kids in Suisun City Little League. 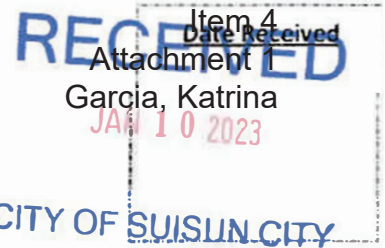

1. What are your top 3 priorities for Suisun City? Why do you think these are most important?

My top three priorities and the reasons for their importance are stated below:

1. Fiscal Stability – Suisun City's budget is less than robust. In fact, Suisun City has a smaller general fund budget (\$23M) than the City of Dixon (\$28M), who is only 2/3rd the population of Suisun. Suisun city gets on average 1/3rd of the sales tax revenue per capita as other California Cities. This results in a myriad of civic shortcomings, which can be seen in our landscaping, policing, and road maintenance. Furthermore, the temporary sales tax, Measure S, is scheduled to end in 2024, putting a \$2-3M hole in an already meager budget.
2. Maintaining Existing Assets – Suisun is a mature and storied city. While the age of this City provides character, it also results in costly maintenance. The City has not kept up with existing landscaping and park maintenance. The City has not kept up with road maintenance. The City has not kept up with homeless response and code enforcement. Because the City has limited resources, we are left with making difficult choices and our existing assets are deteriorating at fast rates. We must turn attention to maintaining what we have in good condition, before bigger bills come due.
3. Sustainable Development – Sitting at the edge of an environmentally sensitive marsh, with sea-levels rising, Suisun must take a future-proof approach to development. Rising water will not only create environmental harm, but will damage infrastructure, homes, and affect businesses. Planning for future scenarios and promoting a mix of high-quality industrial, commercial, and transit-oriented developments will ensure Suisun is environmentally and fiscally sustainable for generations to come.

2. What are the key issues you see facing our community? Why do you think these are the key issues and what might be the solutions?

The City of Suisun City faces many issues that are shared with communities in California. Homelessness, cleanliness, providing public safety, and fiscal stability. I believe these are the key issues, because they have an impact on our daily lives and are ones we as a community can actually change.

1. Homelessness – Nearly every city has a homeless population, but not all cities handle it the same way. Turning a blind eye and waiting for someone else to fix the problem has not been working. The locations that have the biggest impact on homelessness are the ones that create partnerships. If things are going to change, we have to change the ways we are doing things. Suisun must partner with Fairfield, the County, and the State to consolidate resources and adopt a plan. Strict enforcement along with presentation of opportunities for the homeless will get them out of our neighborhoods and into the facilities or locations that are more appropriate. Homelessness is not a crime, but people living in public spaces is not the solution.
2. Cleanliness – There is already a volunteer organization the Suisun City Clean Team that helps keep our City clean. They do a fantastic job, but more is needed. It is not right to ask citizens to pick up trash that is blowing from a business's trash can or homeless encampment. We need enforcement of commercial trash receptacles along with

providing more public trash cans around the City. I would also like to explore partnering with the City of Fairfield to have the homeless population get paid for picking up trash in our community. It has been shown to be effective in Fairfield and San Jose.

3. Public Safety – Police and Fire in Suisun City are underfunded. While they provide great service with the resource they are provided, their pay and staffing are not on par with other Solano Cities. This results in high turnover rates and unfilled positions. The City must plan to increase revenues and increase public safety worker pay along with it.
4. Fiscal Stability – Nearly all the issues that have been stated before are a result of Suisun's poor fiscal health. Rich communities don't have these issues. They can pay for a healthy public works department, public housing, and a fully staffed police and fire department. In Suisun, we make due with what we have. That is not good enough anymore. The City must plan for fiscal growth and stability for the near and long term. This means conducting a land-use analysis of remaining parcels to identify best developments that would maximize tax revenue. This also means a renewal of Measure S.

3.What is your vision for Suisun City and how would you like the City to look in 10 years?

My vision for Suisun City is a sustainable one. One that has identified developments for the remaining parcels and is under construction for most of them. One that has planned for sea-level rise and developed partnerships to fund improvements. A Suisun City that has a vibrant downtown, with people of all ages being able to find entertainment and dining experiences. In 10 years I want Suisun City to look like it is embracing the 21st century by creating transit-oriented development at the train station and mixed-use developments downtown. I want Suisun in 10 years to look like it paves its streets and takes care of its landscaping. In 10 years, I want Suisun City to look sustainable, maintained, and inviting.

I have earned two master's degrees from Cal Poly, one in City and Regional Planning and one in Engineering. I have used these degrees to attain employment in the government transportation field. I worked for the Solano Transportation Authority for 9 years and recently began working as Director of Planning for SacRT. I know how government works, I know how the funding works, and I know how to build relationships with partner agencies. I am inquisitive, a strong listener, and make decisions based on the facts at hand. I do not follow political party lines when making decisions for the community.

I have been involved in Suisun civic service since 2018. Originally serving as chair of the Parks & Recreation Commission, I was appointed to Suisun Council in 2019. I am also on the Board of Directors for a local non-profit, Sustainable Solano. I am committed to Suisun City's success.

1) My top three priorities for Suisun City are public safety, economic vitality, and homelessness. Our community must enjoy all the great things our city has to offer. RESOLUTION NO. 2023-

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SUISUN CITY
APPOINTING _____ TO THE VACANT COUNCILMEMBER SEAT
FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE CURRENT TERM**

WHEREAS, after the November 8, 2022 election, a then-Councilmember whose term was set to end in 2024 was elected to the office of the Mayor. Once the Councilmember was sworn in as Mayor, her Council seat became vacant.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Suisun City Municipal Code Section 2.04.040 and Section 36512 of the Government Code, the Council must fill the vacancy by appointment, or call a special election to fill the vacancy, within 60 days of the vacancy, i.e., by February 3, 2023. Government Code Section 36512 does not provide any specific guidance on the manner in which the Council selects an individual to fill a vacancy.

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 36512(b)(2)(B) also provides that “if the vacancy occurs in the second half of a term of office, the person appointed to fill the vacancy shall hold office for the unexpired term of the former incumbent.” Because the vacancy occurred in the second half of the councilmember’s term, any appointment will run through the end of the term.

WHEREAS, at the Council meeting on December 6, 2022, the Council directed the City Attorney’s office to return at the December 20, 2022 meeting with the appropriate documentation to adopt an application and interview process.

WHEREAS, on December 20, 2022, the Council agreed on an application and interview process and, accordingly, the Council adopted Resolution No. 2022-167, adopting the procedures related to the filling of the vacancy on the City Council.

WHEREAS, the Council reviewed and considered all properly submitted applications and interviewed 11 applicants on January 17, 2023, during a publicly noticed “town hall”-style public meeting, and selected six applicants to move on to the January 24, 2023 Council meeting, for further discussion and deliberation regarding the remaining applicants.

WHEREAS, at the Council meeting on January 24, 2023, the Council conducted a further interview of the remaining applicants and, afterward, discussed and deliberated for the purpose of selecting one applicant to appoint to the vacant councilmember seat.

1 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of
2 Suisun City as follows:

3 **Section 1.** The recitals hereto are true and correct and by this reference
4 incorporated herein.

5 **Section 2.** Pursuant to Suisun Municipal Code Section 2.04.040 and Government
6 Code Section 36512, the Council hereby appoints _____ to fill the vacant
7 seat on the City Council for the remainder of the vacated seat's term, which will terminate at
8 the end of 2024.

9 **Section 3.** If any provision of this Resolution or the application of any such
10 provision to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other
11 provisions or applications of this Resolution that can be given effect without the invalid
12 provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Resolution are severable. The
13 Council declares that the Council would have adopted this Resolution irrespective of the
14 invalidity of any particular portion of this Resolution.

15 **Section 4.** This Resolution shall take effect and be in full force immediately after
16 its adoption by the Council, and shall expire upon the expiration of the vacated seat's term.
