Code Enforcement Updates

Erin Drive

Last September, the residence experienced a fire and has remained in disrepair for months. The fire's aftermath affected multiple neighbors as rodents and ash migrated from the property to the surrounding neighborhood. The inaction on the property resulted in a code enforcement case in which, over several months, Code Enforcement has attempted to contact the owner. After sticking with this case, Code Enforcement is happy to share that improvements have commenced to the structure. Based on a recent inspection, the weeds have cleared, and windows and the garage are covered, indicating repairs are occurring to the interior. The neighbors stated that the rodent issue has decreased. The photos below show the progress that has been made on the property.





Sunset Ave Vacant Lot

In January 2023, Code Enforcement inspected the property on the east side of Sunset Avenue. During this visit, we found a homeless encampment that held discarded junk, two tents, and a small fire. After working with the property owner, the property has fully

transitioned from a lot filled with trash and an encampment to a clear one with no occupants on the property. These are the before and after photos.





Tractor Supply Company (TSC)

I'm very excited about this project! Tractor Supply is finally happening and an official groundbreaking was held on April 27th to officially kick off the development of this project. We had a great turnout of elected officials and VIPs! Tractor Supply Company has a policy of not locating another store within 15 miles, so Suisun City will have the only TSC in the area! According to the developer, the project should be completed by October in order to be open for the Christmas shopping season! Look for a ribbon cutting in the fall!



Starbucks Ground Breaking

Local dignitaries celebrated the ground breaking on Monday, April 24, for Starbucks' newest location in Suisun City, California. The new coffee shop will be located at the corner of Walters Road and Highway 12 and is expected to open this fall. The new Starbucks will be 2,200 square

feet with a 625 square foot outdoor patio seating area, along with a double drive thru will accommodate that seventeen vehicles. This will be second location the for Starbucks in Suisun City. The new Starbucks location will offer a warm and welcoming atmosphere, free Wi-Fi, and a wide selection of coffee, tea, and other delicious beverages. Customers can also enjoy a range of breakfast and lunch including options, pastries, sandwiches, and salads.

PUBLIC WORKS ENGINEERING:

Lawler Ranch Park – Playground Fall Material Maintenance Project

The vendor who installed the pour-in-place fall material within the two play structure areas met with staff on-site to assess the existing fall material. The vendor recommended that the city perform maintenance and resealing of the fall material for safety and to add some longevity to the life of the product. The maintenance work was performed on Monday, April 10th. Construction fencing was installed to protect both areas and allow the fall material to adequately dry and cure.

Pothole Repair on Highway 12 – CalTrans Project

Caltrans repaired a number of potholes and highway issues during April.

PUBLIC WORKS MAINTENANCE DIVISION:

The Maintenance Division does a lot of work throughout the city. Here is a snapshot of work performed during March:

- Monday and Thursday twice weekly trash runs and illegal dump pickups (approximately 186 trash cans).

- Removed old valve boxes and built four (4) new ones at the Sports Complex.
- Mowed Park-N-Ride Parking lot area.
- Mowed triangle on Hwy 12 eastbound on-ramp from Civic Center Blvd.





- Cleaned tack oil trailer.
- Removed homeless encampment by Mike Day Park.
- Preventative maintenance to traffic cabinet replaced cabinet light.
- Readjusted door at Heritage Bathrooms.
- Repaired sound wall at Harbor Park and on Civic Center Blvd. Installed caps for the end of the wall.
- Repaired an irrigation leak at Merganser and Parkside (Heritage Park LLD).
- Mowed Independence and Patriot Parks (Peterson Ranch LLD).

- Prepared needed equipment for Solano Irrigation District (SID) patches.



Recreation, Parks, Marina & Arts

Staff Development

Several Administration and Management staff members attended the annual California's Park & Recreation Society's Conference & Expo. Staff spent time in a variety of eductional sessions covering all aspects of recreation and building connections with other recreation professionals throughout California over the four-day conference. Recreation Coordinator Justeen Singley spent time in sessions specializing in programs, acivites and resources for our aging population. One possible

great program/activity to take away was Senior Games. This program would be a version of the Olympic Games but for seniors.







Spring Break Camp

Twenty-five elementary school age youth spent their spring break with our rock star staff at camp. Youth enjoyed fun and educational activities that included Alka-Seltzer rockets, gardening club, and even a field trip to see the new Mario Movie.

Marina

Marina staff has been working hard to improve our guest dock area by installing new signage that establishes visiting hours and regulations for guests. Effective immediately, the visiting hours for our guest dock are from 7 am to 9 pm. We kindly ask all visitors to adhere to these hours, as they have been put in place to ensure the safety and security of our Marina. In addition, we have implemented a 4-hour mooring limit per 24-hour period for guests. Guests wishing to stay longer than 4 hours may do so by completing a guest use agreement at the Harbor Masters Office. We believe that these new regulations will improve the overall experience and appearance at the marina for both our residents and our guests at the marina.

The marina had two docked derelict boats that had been abandoned by marina tenants. These boats were removed, detoxed, and taken to the dump for disposal. Funding for the removal of the two boats will be paid for by the Surrendered and Abandoned Vessel Exchange (SAVE) Grant. This grant helps remove abandoned and surrendered derelict boats from the waterways to prevent environmental hazards and damage. The previous weeks' rainstorms had caused transient boats to sink in the waterway. This unregistered boat was



a navigational hazard and an environmental threat. With help from the Public Works department and assistance from the Police Department staff were able to remove the boat to prevent an oil spill and hazard.

Lambrecht Sports Complex

On Saturday, April 15th and 16th, the Recreation Department hosted the fourth tournament of 2023. Twelve youth teams with ages ranging from 13 to 14 and all from the surrounding areas battled it out for the championship. With only 12 teams, only two of the fields were utilized over the weekend. Given the size of the tournament, the snack bar was a little slow but still managed to sell a little over \$1,300 in product. Recreation staff will take a break this weekend from tournaments but will definitely be ready to go for the following four weekends.

April Revenue Summary

As the weather warms up, so do the rentals and programs. This April, individuals utilized our facilities for 83 paid events. This includes parties both indoor and outdoor, training, church services, and sports practices or games. These rentals and leases took place at the Joseph Nelson Community Center, the Lambrecht Sports Complex, and Community Parks, for a total of \$28,220. Our recreation programs, after school programs, camps and snack bar totaled \$24,611. This brings the total for the month of April to \$52,831.

Early Childhood First Solano 5 Recreation Classes

There are only a couple of spots left in May's Basketball Class! The series is free for all Solano County residents ages 2-4, and thanks to the First 5 Solano funding, it will provide 20 free recreation classes for ages 2-4 between September 2022-June 2023. The May and June classes will wrap up the First 5 Solano funded series, and it is expected that there will be more recreation classes for the 2-4-year-old range offered through Suisun City RPM Department going forward.

Seniors

Tax appointments ended at the Joseph Nelson Community Center on Thursday, April 13th. We are happy to announce that the AARP Foundation Tax-Aide prepared 639 tax returns for seniors and ower to middle-income citizens of Solano County, all for free. This was another successful partnership and we were happy to provide space for this great program.

Social Recreation Grant

The department received word that the RPM Department's application to the North Bay Regional Center's 'Social Recreation Grant' was accepted! The RPM Department will receive \$19,000 to purchase supplies and materials towards a 'Camp Chaos' program in Summer 2023 - a camp program for youth with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities (I/DD) - and for the development of future inclusive programming.

Camp Chaos holds a higher camper-to-staff ratio and is aimed at providing I/DD youth with opportunities to socialize, participate in activities, to make new friends, and to do so with ample support. The grant award will also cover appropriate staff trainings, as there are more and more I/DD youth in RPM Department after school and camp programs. The Social Recreation Grant program is aimed at providing more integrated social and recreation programs for youth with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities (I/DD). The RPM Department is excited to provide programs to the underserved special needs population.



Camp Chaos

Thanks to a grant from North Bay Regional Center and in partnership with Special Care Services, Suisun City RPM is hosting the first ever 'Camp Chaos' program in Suisun City. Camp Chaos is a summer program for youth with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) and holds a higher camper-to-staff ratio. It is aimed at providing I/DD youth with opportunities to socialize. participate

activities, make new friends, and do so with ample support. Camp Chaos will take place at the Nelson Center from August 1-3, with an AM session (9:30 am-11:30 am) for ages 3-9 and a PM session (1:00 pm-3:00 pm) for ages 10-18. There is a small admin fee of \$30 for all participants, but North Bay Regional Center clients are able to get the remaining program fee subsidized. Proposition 64 Public Health and Safety Cohort 3 Grant Program

Recreation Supervisor Marvin Mora received word that the RPM and Police Department's application towards the Proposition 64 Public Health and Safety grant program was recommended to be funded! The Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) Executive Board will officially vote to fund all Cohort 3 recommendations on April $13^{\rm th}$. It is anticipated that the BSCC Executive Board will vote to fund all recommendations. Suisun City will receive $\sim 2.29 million over a 5-year period. This was a competitive grant process for projects that address local impacts due to the legalization of cannabis in California. Eligible applicants for the program are local government agencies that do not ban either indoor and outdoor commercial cannabis cultivation, or retail sale of cannabis or cannabis products.

The project will be officially called Suisun City's Teen Development & Cannabis Education Program. The project will establish a Suisun City Police Activities League (PAL) program for middle school and high school youth that combines existing PAL structure and resources with cannabis prevention and education curriculum developed by Suisun City RPM staff and the Solano County Office of Education. It will support a Recreation Supervisor to oversee the project and a School Resource Officer that will participate in school intervention efforts and will focus on mentoring, counseling, building relationships with youth, and acting as an extension of the program. The program will give Suisun City teens the chance to mature, gain valuable leadership and life skills, participate in unique enrichment and recreation opportunities, and set themselves for lifelong success – all with cannabis prevention and education as its nexus. The RPM and Police Departments are excited to receive this funding and can't wait to impact the teens of Suisun City.

BrewBash At The Basin

We are thrilled to report that BrewBash at the Basin was a great success! The City's Recreation, Parks, and Marina department and the Fairfield-Suisun Rotary co-hosted the event on April 22, 2023, and the event was well attended. We would like to thank all the local breweries who generously donated their beer, time, and expertise to make this event possible. We are also grateful to all those who attended, sponsored, and volunteered at the event, and we look forward to continuing to support our local youth through future events.
