

CITY AGENDA ITEM: Council Consideration and possible action to adopt Resolution No. 2023-__: A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Suisun City proclaiming a local emergency persists and authorizing the use of remote teleconference meeting procedures by the City's legislative bodies, as authorized by government code section 54953(e) et seq., through February 15, 2023.

FISCAL IMPACT: None

STRATEGIC PLAN: Provide Good Governance.

BACKGROUND: A number of laws have changed since the beginning of the COVID pandemic related to the Brown Act as it relates to teleconferenced public meetings, both from Governor Newsom's Executive Orders and recently from the enactment of Assembly Bill 361, which took effect October 1, 2021, allowing continued remote teleconference meetings without traditional Brown Act compliance, provided certain findings can be made related to the ongoing state of emergency and subject to adherence to certain new noticing and public participation requirements.

The City, as all public agencies in California, must invoke and adhere to AB 361 and its modifications on certain elements of remote public meetings, or else revert to traditional Brown Act compliance. The major change associated with continuing remote meetings under AB 361 is that the public must now be allowed to make comments in real-time during the public comment period, either telephonically or electronically (such as by Zoom). No physical location for public comment need be provided.

Assembly Bill 361, which took effect October 1, 2021, allowing continued remote teleconference meetings without traditional Brown Act compliance, provided certain findings can be made related to the ongoing state of emergency and subject to adherence to certain new noticing and public participation requirements,

On October 19, 2021 the City of Suisun City passed a resolution proclaiming that a local emergency persists and authorizing the transition to use of remote teleconference meeting procedures by City's the legislative bodies, as authorized by government code section 54953(e) et seq., for the initial period of October 19, 2021 through November 18, 2021.

STAFF REPORT: This is a recurring resolution, after 30 days following the initial invocation of AB 361, continued reliance on AB 361 for subsequent meetings requires the following:

- 1. Either the "state of emergency" must remain active, or state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing; and
- 2. No later than 30 days after teleconferencing for the first time under AB 361 rules, and every 30 days thereafter, the legislative body, by majority vote, finds that it has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency and at least one of the following circumstances exist:
 - The state of emergency continues to impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person; or
 - State or local officials continue to impose recommended measures to promote social distancing.

Continued reliance on AB 361 will require adoption of a new resolution making the required findings every 30 days.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the City Council adopt Resolution No. 2023—

: A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Suisun City proclaiming a local emergency persists and authorizing the transition to use of remote teleconference meeting procedures by City's the legislative bodies, as authorized by government code section 54953(e) et seq., through February 15, 2023.

RESOLUTION NO. 2023-

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SUISUN CITY PROCLAIMING A LOCAL EMERGENCY PERSISTS AND AUTHORIZING THE TRANSITION TO USE OF REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETING PROCEDURES BY CITY'S THE LEGISLATIVE BODIES, AS AUTHORIZED BY GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 54953(E) ET SEO., THROUGH FEBRUARY 15, 2023.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Suisun City is committed to preserving and nurturing public access, transparency, observation and participation in its meetings and the meetings of each of its legislative bodies; and

WHEREAS, all meetings of the City's legislative bodies are open and public, as required by the Ralph M. Brown Act, codified as Government Code sections 54950 *et seq.*, so that any member of the public may attend, participate, and observe the City's legislative bodies conduct their business; and

WHEREAS, the Brown Act, as amended by Assembly Bill 361 (2021), amending Government Code section 54953(e) *et seq.*, allows for remote teleconferencing observation and participation in meetings by members of a legislative body and members of the public, without compliance with the requirements of Government Code section 54953(b)(3), subject to the existence of certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, the initial required condition is a declaration of a state of emergency by the Governor pursuant to the California Emergency Services Act, Government Code section 8625, proclaiming the existence of conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the state and within the boundaries of the City, as provided in Government Code section 8558; and

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, pursuant to Government Code Section 8625, Governor Newsom declared the existence of a state of emergency for the State of California, in response to the outbreak of respiratory illness due to a novel coronavirus (a disease now known as COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020, the City's Director of Emergency Services declared a local emergency for the City pursuant to Chapter 2.32 of the Suisun City Municipal Code, finding that conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property have arisen within the City as a result of the COVID-19 virus and that these conditions are or are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the City; and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 2020-40, ratifying the Director of Emergency Services' declaration of local emergency; and

WHEREAS, Government Code section 54953(e) further requires that state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing; or, the legislative body of the City finds that meeting in person would present imminent risk to the health and safety of attendees; and

WHEREAS, the Council hereby finds that such emergency conditions now exist in the City, such that meeting in person for the meetings of the legislative bodies of the City would present imminent risk to the health and safety of attendees as a result of the increased risk of the spread of the COVID-19 virus among those in attendance; and

WHEREAS, the Council hereby finds that the state of emergency due to the COVID-19 virus and the conditions related thereto has caused, and will continue to cause, conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons within the City that are likely to be beyond the control of services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the City, and thereby affirms, authorizes, and proclaims that the existence of a local emergency persists throughout the City, and ratifies the proclamation of state of emergency by the Governor of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, the Council hereby finds that, as a consequence of the existing local emergency, the legislative bodies of the City shall conduct their meetings without compliance with Government Code section 54953(b)(3), and shall instead comply with the remote teleconference meeting requirements as authorized by Government Code section 54953(e) *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, the Council affirms that it will allow for observation and participation by Councilmembers and the public by allowing limited in-person attendance, as well as allowing public participation and comment in real time via Zoom or by telephone, in an effort to protect the constitutional and statutory rights of all attendees.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SUISUN CITY FINDS, RESOLVES, AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated herein Resolution by reference.

Section 2. The Council hereby recognizes and affirms the existence and conditions of a state of emergency as proclaimed by the Governor, the existence of emergency conditions in the City, and affirms, authorizes, and proclaims that the existence of a local emergency persists throughout the City.

Section 3. The Council hereby ratifies the Governor of the State of California's Proclamation of State of Emergency, effective as of its issuance date of March 4, 2020.

<u>Section 4.</u> Further, the Council finds that holding the meetings of the City's legislative bodies in person with no limitations to attendance would present imminent risk to the health and safety of attendees as a result of the increased risk of the spread of the COVID-19 virus among those in attendance, as required by Government Code section 54953(e) *et seq.*

Section 5. The City Manager and legislative bodies of the City are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution

BACKGROUND: In February 2022 the Fire Department sought approval from the City Council to purchase a Golden State Type 5 wildland engine. The purchase of the apparatus (\$356,308.56) and the budget for additional equipment (\$120,000.00) was approved by Resolution No. 2022-18.

STAFF REPORT: The fire department is seeking approval to purchase mobile and portable radios to be utilized in the new Type 5 Wildland Unit currently in production. The purchase and installation of these radios will ensure continuity of communications between the crews and allow the unit to be placed into service immediately after arrival. The total cost for the purchase is not to exceed \$43,000. There is no additional cost for installation. Motorola is a pre-authorized sole source provider listed on the Houston-Galveston Area Council Cooperative Purchasing Program (HGACBuy). Suisun City is a member of HGACBuy.

FISCAL IMPACT: State Funding of \$2.5 million with no local match.

STRATEGIC PLAN: Ensure Fiscal Solvency.

BACKGROUND: The Montebello Vista Lighting and Landscape Maintenance Assessment District does not generate sufficient revenue to cover expenses related to the maintenance of Montebello Vista Park, streetlight electricity/maintenance, and Walters Road entrance and median maintenance. Currently, the Assessment District Fund is in the negative by more than \$50,000. The Recreation, Parks, and Marina (RPM) Department submitted applications for the Statewide Development Community Revitalization Program Round 4 in 2021 and the Rural Recreation and Tourism Program in 2022 for improvements to Montebello Vista Park, but was not awarded for either.

In September 2021, Suisun City Council dedicated \$375,000 of American Rescue Plan Act Funds to fund a community garden. In October 2021, Suisun City Council approved the implementation of the Prosperity Garden Park on a 1.73 acre City owned lot located on Blossom Ave, adjacent to the McCoy Creek Bike Trail Phase 3. Finally in March 2022, Suisun City Council approved a contract with Melton Design Group for the design plan and project coordination of the Prosperity Garden Park.

STAFF REPORT: In June 2022, the RPM Department was notified that funding for Prosperity Garden Park and Montebello Vista Park was included in 2022-2023 California State Budget.

Funding towards Prosperity Garden Park and Montebello Vista Park is part of the State of California Department of Parks and Recreation's "Local Assistance Specified Grants' program. Because funding is in the form of a grant, the City of Suisun City must pass an authorizing resolution and enter into contract with the California Office of Grants and Local Services (OGALS) in order to utilize funds and complete both parks projects.

WHEREAS, the City of Suisun City (the "City") has conducted proceedings pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act, Chapter 2.5 of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5, commencing with Section 53311, of the California Government Code (the "Act") to establish "City of Suisun City Community Facilities District No. 2 (Municipal Services)" (the "CFD") for the purpose of financing certain municipal services (the "Services) as provided in the Act; and

SECTION TWO: The City Manager or designee, or an employee or consultant of the City, is hereby authorized and directed each fiscal year to determine the specific Special Tax to be levied for the next ensuing fiscal year for each parcel of real property within the CFD, including all territory annexed to the CFD prior to the date hereof, in the manner and as provided in the Rate and Method.

SECTION THREE: Exemptions from the levy of the Special Tax shall be as provided in the Resolution of Formation, the Rate and Method and the applicable provisions of the Act. In no event shall the Special Tax be levied on any parcel within the CFD in excess of the maximum Special Tax specified in the Rate and Method.

SECTION FOUR: All of the collections of the Special Tax shall be used as provided in the Act and in the Resolution of Formation, including, but not limited to, the payment of costs of the Services, the payment of the costs of the City in administering the CFD, and the costs of collecting and administering the Special Tax.

SECTION FIVE: The Special Tax shall be collected in the same manner as ordinary ad valorem taxes are collected and shall have the same lien priority, and be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure and sale in cases of delinquency as provided for ad valorem taxes; provided, however, that the Council may provide for other appropriate methods of collection by resolution(s) of the Council. The City Manager of the City (or the City Manager's designee) is hereby authorized and directed to provide all necessary information to the auditor/tax collector of the County of Solano in order to effect proper billing and collection of the Special Tax, so that the Special Tax shall be included on the secured property tax roll of the County of Solano for fiscal year 2022-23 and for each fiscal year thereafter, as set forth above, until no longer required to pay for the Services or until otherwise terminated by the City.

SECTION SIX: If for any reason any portion of this Ordinance is found to be invalid, or if the Special Tax is found inapplicable to any particular parcel within the CFD, including all territory annexed to the CFD prior to the date hereof, by a court of competent jurisdiction, the balance of this Ordinance and the application of the Special Tax to the remaining parcels within the CFD, including all territory annexed to the CFD prior to the date hereof, shall not be affected.

SECTION SEVEN: The Mayor shall sign this Ordinance and the City Clerk shall cause the same to be published immediately after its passage at least once in a newspaper of general circulation circulated in the City.

SECTION EIGHT: This Council affirms the provisions of Ordinance No. 684 except to the extent any terms of such Ordinance are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, in which case the terms of this Ordinance shall govern.

Specifically, Section 36512 provides that a city council shall, within 60 days of the date of vacancy (i.e., no later than February 3, 2023), fill such vacancy by appointment, or call a special election to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the vacated term. Section 36512 does not provide any specific guidance on the manner in which the City Council selects an individual to fill a vacancy. Council has provided direction for an application process to fill the vacancy. A summary of the application process determined by the City Council is provided in the Background section of this report.

Council has chosen to accept applications and conduct interviews to fill the vacancy. The below-described process incorporates modifications pursuant to Council's direction:

- 1. Applications submittal period began on December 22, 2022, at start of business, and closed on January 10, 2023, at 5:00 p.m.
- 2. Applicants must be registered voters and residents of the City.
- 3. Applications must include the applicant's full name, address, statement stating that applicant is a registered voter of the City, and a statement of qualifications.
- 4. All applications are a public record pursuant to the California Public Records Act (and also subject to the same exemptions).
- 5. The Council has reviewed and considered all properly submitted applications and will interview such applicants at this noticed meeting.
- 6. After the interviews, the Council will deliberate and narrow the number of applicants to be considered for appointment at its regular meeting on January 24, 2023, to a maximum of seven.
- 7. Any applicant who was a candidate for a seat on the Council in the November 8, 2022 election will be included in the number of applicants to be considered for appointment at the regular meeting of the Council on January 24, 2023.

- 8. City residents who are registered voters of the City could submit suggested interview questions. These questions were to be submitted to the City Clerk's Office by January 10, 2023 at 5:00 p.m.
- 9. At its regular meeting on January 24, 2023 (or at a later meeting of the Council's choosing), the Council will meet for the purpose of appointing an applicant to the Council. The process will be as follows:
 - a. Discussion and deliberation of applicants remaining following the interview process by Mayor and Council.
 - b. The Mayor shall make the appointment subject to the ratification by the full Council.
 - c. Ratification of an appointment shall require three affirmative votes of the Council. The Mayor may also vote and be counted.
- 10. The failure to strictly adhere to these guidelines will not affect the legality and effectiveness of any appointment made.
- 11. These procedures and timelines will no longer be effective upon an individual being appointed to fill the vacancy.

The appointed councilmember will hold office for the unexpired balance of the vacated seat's term, as the vacancy occurred in the second half of the former incumbent's term.

A proposed process to conduct interview efficiently and fairly has been provided for consideration by the Council.

STAFF REPORT: At the Council meeting on December 6, 2022, the Council directed the City Attorney's office to return at the December 20, 2022 meeting with the appropriate documentation to adopt an application and interview process. At today's town hall meeting, the City Council will interview all the applicants and narrow the pool down to no more than 7 applicants. On January 24, 2023, the City Council will deliberate on the 7 or fewer applicants, and choose one candidate to fill the seat. The item may be continued further, but **the City Council must take action no later than February 3, 2023,** which is the date 60 days following the date the council seat was vacated (December 6, 2022). If the City Council does not appoint to the vacant seat, it will call a special election.

<u>Proposed procedure to conduct interviews and narrow down the</u> number of candidates to no more than 7:

The proposed process seeks to balance efficiency and fairness. Because the City Council is interviewing 12 candidates, the time each candidate will have to speak, including answering council questions, is limited. The strict time limitations are intended to ensure candidates have equal time and are not haphazardly provided more or less time, and therefore a bigger or smaller platform, than other candidates. Asking all candidates the same questions, without follow-up or surprise questions, is also intended to avoid proving an advantage or disadvantage to any candidate. For the same reason, candidates may not speak during public comment on this item so as to avoid candidates unfairly adding time to their interviews and to avoid candidates supporting or undermining any other candidate. Therefore, in light of the above, the following is the proposed procedure for today's meeting:

- Any applicant who is not physically present for the interview shall be disqualified unless
 the City Council finds their absence excusable with just cause. Candidates who are
 excused must participate by Zoom, and have their camera on for the entirety of their
 interview.
- The City Clerk will randomly draw names to set the order for interviews.
- Applicants will have an opportunity to provide a one minute opening statement at the beginning of their interview and a one minute closing statement at the end of their interview.
- Applicants will have one minute to answer each of four questions from Council. The same questions will be asked of all applicants.
- Public Comment will open after all applicants have been interviewed and shall be limited to 2 minutes per speaker.
- Applicants will not be allowed to participate in Public Comment on this item.
- Council will deliberate following all interviews and Public Comment.
- Council stipulated in the rules for the process that any applicant for Council who was on the November 2022 ballot as a candidate for Council shall be automatically moved forward in the process to the finals. As long as applicant Katrina Garcia shows up for the interviews, she will automatically move forward to the final round as she was the only candidate for Council on the November 2022 ballot who has applied for appointment.
- No more than seven applicants can move on to the final round, so no more than six other applicants can be moved forward.
- Councilmembers will vote on each applicant whether to move forward to final consideration at the January 24th Council meeting. Candidates will move on to the next round only with Council majority.
- If the first round of voting does not result in 7 or fewer total candidates, Council will do another round of voting. All candidates who did not obtain a majority vote on the first round of voting are eliminated and will not be considered on following rounds. Council will continue to vote until no more than 7 candidates are chosen to move forward.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the City Council follow the proposed procedures for interviewing City Council applicants.

1.What are your top 3 priorities for Suisun City? Why do you think these are most important? My top three priorities and the reasons for their importance are stated below:

- 1. <u>Fiscal Stability</u> Suisun City's budget is less than robust. In fact, Suisun City has a smaller general fund budget (\$23M) than the City of Dixon (\$28M), who is only 2/3rd the population of Suisun. Suisun city gets on average 1/3rd of the sales tax revenue per capita as other California Cities. This results in a myriad of civic shortcomings, which can be seen in our landscaping, policing, and road maintenance. Furthermore, the temporary sales tax, Measure S, is scheduled to end in 2024, putting a \$2-3M hole in an already meager budget.
- 2. Maintaining Existing Assets Suisun is a mature and storied city. While the age of this City provides character, it also results in costly maintenance. The City has not kept up with existing landscaping and park maintenance. The City has not kept up with road maintenance. The City has not kept up with homeless response and code enforcement. Because the City has limited resources, we are left with making difficult choices and our existing assets are deteriorating as fast rates. We must turn attention to maintaining what we have in good condition, before bigger bills come due.
- 3. <u>Sustainable Development</u> Sitting at the edge of an environmentally sensitive marsh, with sea-levels rising, Suisun must take a future-proof approach to development. Rising water will not only create environmental harm, but will damage infrastructure, homes, and affect businesses. Planning for future scenarios and promoting a mix of high-quality industrial, commercial, and transit-oriented developments will ensure Suisun is environmentally and fiscally sustainable for generations to come.

2. What are the key issues you see facing our community? Why do you think these are the key issues and what might be the solutions?

The City of Suisun City faces many issues that are shared with communities in California. Homelessness, cleanliness, providing public safety, and fiscal stability. I believe these are the key issues, because they have an impact on our daily lives and are ones we as a community can actually change.

- 1. Homelessness Nearly every city has a homeless population, but not all cities handle it the same way. Turning a blind eye and waiting for someone else to fix the problem has not been working. The locations that have the biggest impact on homelessness are the ones that create partnerships. If things are going to change, we have the change the ways we are doing things. Suisun must partner with Fairfield, the County, and the State to consolidate resources and adopt a plan. Strict enforcement along with presentation of opportunities for the homeless will get them out of our neighborhoods and into the facilities or locations that are more appropriate. Homelessness is not a crime, but people living in public spaces is not the solution.
- 2. Cleanliness There is already a volunteer organization the Suisun City Clean Team that helps keep our City clean. They do a fantastic job, but more is needed. It is not right to ask citizens to pick up trash that is blowing from a business's trash can or homeless encampment. We need enforcement of commercial trash receptacles along with

providing more public trash cans around the City. I would also like to explore partnering with the City of Fairfield to have the homeless population get paid for picking up trash in our community. It has been shown to be effective in Fairfield and San Jose.

- 3. Public Safety Police and Fire in Suisun City are underfunded. While they provide great service with the resource they are provided, their pay and staffing are not on par with other Solano Cities. This results in high turnover rates and unfilled positions. The City must plan to increase revenues and increase public safety worker pay along with it.
- 4. Fiscal Stability Nearly all the issues that have been stated before are a result of Suisun's poor fiscal health. Rich communities don't have these issues. They can pay for a healthy public works department, public housing, and a fully staffed police and fire department. In Suisun, we make due with what we have. That is not good enough anymore. The City must plan for fiscal growth and stability for the near and long term. This means conducting a land-use analysis of remaining parcels to identify best developments that would maximize tax revenue. This also means a renewal of Measure S.
- 3.What is your vision for Suisun City and how would you like the City to look in 10 years?

 My vision for Suisun City is a sustainable one. One that has identified developments for the remaining parcels and is under construction for most of them. One that has planned for seallevel rise and developed partnerships to fund improvements. A Suisun City that has a vibrant downtown, with people of all ages being able to find entertainment and dining experiences. In 10 years I want Suisun City to look like it is embracing the 21st century by creating transit-oriented development at the train station and mixed-use developments downtown. I want Suisun in 10 years to look like it paves its streets and takes care of its landscaping. In 10 years, I want Suisun City to look sustainable, maintained, and inviting.
- 4. Please describe how your qualifications, education, and/or work experience/training would be relevant in your role as a Councilmember.

I have earned two master's degrees from Cal Poly, one in City and Regional Planning and one in Engineering. I have used these degrees to attain employment in the government transportation field. I worked for the Solano Transportation Authority for 9 years and recently began working as Director of Planning for SacRT. I know how government works, I know how the funding works, and I know how to build relationships with partner agencies. I am inquisitive, a strong listener, and make decisions based on the facts at hand. I do not follow political party lines when making decisions for the community.





- Economic Development Vacant buildings in the downtown and other areas that can house viable businesses and provide more local employment should be a priority for business recruitment, as well as a program to retain/expand local businesses.
- 3. Infrastructure Streets that have potholes and not repaired have been "kicked down the road" in the past by previous councils for repair in future years. With people filing for damages from these potholes, it is not cost effective to delay fixing the streets in the future. These streets need to be repaired, as well as working with utility companies to upgrade areas that have power outages when there is inclement weather.

2. What are the key issues you see facing our community? Why do you think these are the key issues and what might be the solutions?

Key issues facing the community and possible solutions include:

- Homelessness/Camping on Private Property A possible solution is to work on this on a
 regional basis. As other cities find solutions (tiny houses/transitional housing, etc.) and
 enforce no camping rules, we may find ourselves with more homeless population coming to
 Suisun City. We need to get ahead of this and work regionally, not in silos, to find solutions.
- Revenue Shortfall I believe this is a major issue now and in the near future. Measure S will sunset at the end of 2026. A previous council would not allow a tax measure to go to the voters. Let the voters decide this! Cutting budgets is a solution, but then we find ourselves with diminished services, and hear complaints from citizens about infrastructure, police protection, code enforcement, etc. As City of Suisun City government grapples with this, we should be selling off unused properties (like the buildings owned downtown that have sat vacant for more than 25 years) as a short-term solution. Turn that dormant physical capital into financial capital! This could also help jump start some economic activity on the Waterfront and elsewhere, which would raise tax revenue (both sales tax and property tax).
- Diversified/Increased Tax Base What can we do to diversify and increase our tax base?
 Can we bring in more tourism with our beautiful waterfront? We need beautification, event
 programming of the waterfront space and a marketing program to improve and promote the
 waterfront area to more than local residents. Can we bring in clean industry and/or
 manufacturing? These areas need to be explored further, especially related to pending
 annexation of the Suisun 355 Project.

3. What is your vision for Suisun City and how would you like the City to look in 10 years?

My vision for Suisun City includes a safe, clean, diversified and thriving community for families, singles and seniors with a variety of job opportunities, and a balanced budget with a hefty reserve fund. In 10 years, I would love to see a thriving and safe waterfront with a variety of businesses and activities, no vacant, city-owned buildings, pothole-free streets, regional-wide solutions for homelessness, clean industry, and a wide variety of job opportunities from entry-level to corporate.

4. Please describe how your qualifications, education, and/or work experience/training would be relevant in your role as a Councilmember.

Since 1988, I have had the pleasure and privilege of working with cities, counties, downtown/ Main Street associations, and economic development associations as both an employee and a consultant, as well as serving previously as a Suisun City planning commissioner. I understand the processes of city government in bringing in businesses/industry, how infrastructure is improved, the Brown Act, general and specific plans, crime prevention and how to work with local businesses. I have completed courses and have certificates from the Craig School of Business, Fresno State University in Economic Development, and have obtained an Accredited California Economic Developer designation (ACE) as well as the designation of Certified Main Street Manager (CMSM) from the National Trust/National Main Street Program. I currently work with more than 800 economic development professionals in my day job, and see a lot of information on what other communities are doing – best practices, successes and failures.

5. What has your previous involvement with the City of Suisun City been? Please include any service organizations or community engagement specific to Suisun City you have participated in and what your role was.

Since moving to Suisun City in 1995, I have been very involved. I worked as a consultant 1996-97 to bring the Friday night market/music to the city; which included farmers, food stands and vendors, plus I worked with the city on the Waterfront Days/Festival (at that time, it was not organized by the BID) which included mapping out the vendors and activities and making sure the electricity for the vendors was configured correctly.

After taking a position with the City of Davis' downtown district, I scaled back on involvement, but when I left that job in 2007 and restarted my consulting business, I applied for the Planning Commission, and served for more than a year. I only left the Planning Commission because I was told I had to resign in order to <u>submit</u> an RFP to the city to evaluate their events. I did write, along with a partner, an evaluation of the city's events in late 2008/early 2009.

After redevelopment was eliminated in 2011/2012, I served on an ad-hoc committee to fund Suisun City's fireworks by soliciting donations. The committee eventually became a non-profit, Suisun City Community Services Foundation (now Friends of Suisun Recreation) where I still serve as treasurer.

From 2009-2017, the Suisun City Historic Waterfront BID was a client; in 2020 I was elected to their board of directors and currently serve as its president.

In 2020, I was appointed and served on the Economic Pandemic Impact Community Advisory Committee (EPIC).

6. The City Council regularly meets on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays of each month at 6:30 p.m. and periodically has additional special meetings and study sessions. Councilmembers also serve on a number of subcommittees, commissions, and outside agency boards. Please describe any time constraints or limitations/obligations that might limit your availability for regular meetings, special meetings, or community events.

I do not foresee any time constraints or limitations/obligations that would limit my ability for meetings or events. Even though my work office is in Sacramento, our staff mostly works from

home since the pandemic. I currently work from home 95% of the time, and only travel out of town for my work once or twice a year.

7. Are you aware of the time commitment and the responsibilities associated with serving as a Councilmember and are you prepared to serve without reservation?

Yes – I fully understand the time commitment it takes to be an effective council person.



I worked as a secretary after my children were in school full time and I also worked for the Housing Authority in Riverside. I have always been extremely driven and graduated from high school in my junior year. I took classes at college and after school so that I didn't waste time. My goal then was to become a lawyer because I was constantly helping my neighbors when they were falsely accused.

I have been a missionary and traveled to many countries to build communities and churches and help the less fortunate learn a new trade like tie dying material for apparel and preparing cassava with an easier method since it contains arsenic. I also had the privilege of teaching English as a second language and language arts short term in Nigeria and the Philippines. I completed 8 years of higher education and still take classes to learn new things. I love learning and offer tutoring to anyone who wants it. As a sociologist major, I understand how people groups co-exist and at their core want to see each other be successful. When I worked for the Housing Authority as their Public Housing Drug Elimination Program assistant director, I helped a community on Section 8 learn computers, pass their GED, learn English and attain employment. I collaborated with every agency in the city of Perris to help these residents succeed.

grateful when they were found. After we moved to Carswell Court, we gathered our neighbors together for BBQs and prepared them for National Night Out every year. We became united and I continued to see how else I could help our town. I applied to volunteer at the Suisun City Police Department in 2019, but then Covid hit and right after they approved my application everything shut down. As we went through Covid we did BBQs at a distance in our driveways and made sure our neighbors were okay. Now living on Kellogg Street, I have helped our neighbors get trees removed that were ready to fall, made sure that our community area was cared for and managed by contacting those people at the city who could help. I have trapped almost 12 cats in our community and had them all neutered at the animal shelter in Fairfield so that the population could be controlled in our area.

My goal as a Suisun City resident is to make sure everyone is okay and that everyone has their basic needs met. I am committed to my city and the residents and will do whatever it takes to help them thrive.

Suisun has its geographical limitations that require creativity and strategy to overcome. Considering that the city landlocked from the opportunity for organic expansion, the city council in collaboration with the community must be committed and dedicated to the process of re-imaging Suisun City. Our region has many examples of smaller thriving cities that attract visitors and that have experience economic increases. I believe this reality remains true for our city and I committed to doing work with the existing council to make dreams our reality.

Public Safety

We must continue to fund and support our public safety entities. Our police and fire departments essential to our city infrastructure. Historically, the Suisun Fire Department carried a volunteer component. It is important that the city has a fully funded and staffed public safety agencies to protect and serve our citizens.

Infrastructure Investments

Deferred maintenance reveals itself over time. It is important to make priorities to improve streets and areas of our city that lack the maintenance that our city deserves. Our public works department has done as much as possible with the resources provided. We must plan and act on improving the curb appearance of our city in the most fiscally responsible way possible.

2. Key Issues

Measure S - Sale Tax

We must gain support to continue the existing Measure S Sales Tax in addition to recommended increases to ensure that we avoid losing our city.

Funding Police / Fire

We must maintain a staff and equipped public safety force in our community. With the increases to crime across the county and our immediately annual threat to wildfires, its important that we are prepared and ready for face any forms of adversity that threaten our city infrastructure and citizens.

3. 10 Year Vision

In the next 10 years, I believe that Suisun can be a vibrant and thriving city withing our region. We have the ability to consider how we build and expand downtown in collaboration with businesses and companies to make our area and destination place for the Tri-City area and beyond.

4. Qualifications

As a former board member to the Fairfield-Suisun Unified School District, I have learned many fundamental principles of effective governance. The professional relationship between

members of a governing body is the first of many steps of making a positive impact for the city. As a member of the school board, I received Masters in Governance certification after attending multiple cohort sessions in areas to include Brown Act, human resource, budget and governance team relationships. It is with his experience that I bring a wealth of knowledge and perspectives to local governance and local control. As a communication major, I have leaned and implemented tools and techniques that help to establish effective communication with my colleagues in addition to the community partners/stakeholders who will be impacted by each decision made from the dais. Conflict resolution in addition to knowledge regarding branding/marketing are additional skill sets that can add to the building resume of experience each member of the existing council brings as abilities.

5. Involvement

As a member of the education community, I served multiple years as a member of the Fairfield-Suisun Unified School District and the City of Suisun Joint Committee to discuss various developments in the city and school district and ways that each respective entity could collaborate to benefit families in the city. I have volunteered to support city co-sponsored events like Hop for Hope, car shows and community celebration events honoring our veterans and various events supporting our community at our premier waterfront.

6. Meetings

As an active member of the law enforcement community, I only need advance notification of meetings to make adequate adjustments to my schedule to be available for the various meeting and committees. It will remain my priority to support all things Suisun and be a visible representative of our city.

I am aware of the time commitments and responsibilities associated with serving the citizens of Suisun City on council. I am prepared to serve without reservation.
