MINUTES OF JUNE 5, 2013**

Mick Jessop called the meeting to order at 7:020 p.m.

Approval of Minutes:

The minutes of May 1, 2013 meeting were approved with a 4-0 vote. Motion to approve made by Vice-chair John Pierce, seconded by Roger Begley.

E. GENERAL BUSINESS

Lawler Ranch Park Master Plan: Mick Jessop reported that he is waiting for the official quote to maintain the build out for Lawler Ranch Park and is estimated between \$22,000 - \$30,000. The Commissioners had a discussion about the basketball court on Concept C and a dog park. Commissioner Roger Begley stated that once the quote to maintain the build out is attained, the Commission can move forward with resident meetings. Motion to move forward with the Master Plan was made by Vice-chair John Pierce and seconded by Roger Begley. Chairman Angel Borja would like to add the Lawler Ranch Master Plan to the next meeting agenda. It was asked what could be the timing on this potential project? Mick stated that a possible schedule could be set up if the Lawler Ranch Master Plan goes to and is approved by City Council in August, then the plan could go out to bid in the winter and construction could begin in the spring. There would need to be discussions with Public Works to go over the prospect.

F. REPORTS

1. Staff

- a. City Council – Mick Jessop reported that the 2013-2014 Budget was approved.
- b. Park Development Fund – Mick distributed and discussed the monthly report.
- c. Recreation / Community Center – Cathy Rader discussed the monthly report.
- d. Marina Report – The Marina monthly report was discussed. Commissioner Angel Borja asked if the Marina advertises sales to increase occupancy: i.e. two months for the price of one. Mick stated that the slip rates are low compared to other Marinas and fuel discounts are given also. As incentives the City needs to cover operational costs. Commissioner John Pierce stated that the \$5 boat launch fee is low in comparison with other Marinas and would the City be able to raise the launch fee? Mick stated that it was brought up to City Council at one time and the council was not in favor of a launch fee raise.

- e. Senior Center Report – Mick reported that the Senior Center Re-Grand Opening is rescheduled to August 9 with the seniors moving back into the center possibly by the end of June.
- f. Other: None
 - 2. Commission: Commissioner Roger Begley asked if there was an answer to the irrigation on Kellogg Street that he had from the previous meeting. Roger reported a photo of a Public Works water tank was in the Daily Republic and was wondering if there was an irrigation problem. Commissioner Al Gacosta reported that piles of bark are accumulating at the steel bridge on the bike path and Vice-chair John Pierce reported a mattress by the creek. John added that the Grizzly Island trail is safer for the kids that walk to school and a great addition to Suisun City. Mick asked if all the Commissioners were available for the July 3rd Parks and Recreation Commissions Meeting and since some commissioners and staff would be out of town, the meeting will be changed to July 17th. Mick reminded the commissioners that there will not be an August meeting.
 - 3. Chairman: Chairman Angel Borja will contact Public Works regarding the Lawler Falls Park algae. Angel would like to divide the city parks for the commissioners' inspection reports and rotate quarterly. Cathy Rader will re-type the Parks & Facilities Inspection Report and email the report to the commissioners.

G. ADJOURNMENT




